Please note: **Transnatura Project**

It is the title of the multidisciplinary project designed by the teaching teams of four of the subjects in 3rd year of the Degree in Primary Education. It consists of a two days trip and a night out in nature (so it's an overnight stay) aimed at providing an intense and formative experience in the natural environment which, besides working specific objectives of each of the disciplines, it also facilitates the approach of transversal aspects such as sustainability, healthy living, coexistence and the relationship between school and nature, among others. The date of departure will be confirmed at the beginning of the course (last year in October) . Details regarding timetables, price, itinerary and luggage will be provided at least 10 days before the departure. Attendance is mandatory. In case someone is unable to attend it, he/she will have to prove the reason for missing it and perform a compensatory work previously agreed with the teaching team. The activities carried out during the trip will be part of the continuous evaluation of the different subjects. At the beginning of the course each teacher will specify the learning evidences and the corresponding evaluation criteria. Subjects involved: Didactics of Experimental Sciences, Learning and Development II, Visual Music Education and learning, Physical Education and its Didactics I.

In order to take Practicum course, it is mandatory to hold a Criminal Record Certificate. The student is the unique responsible to get and present it to the centre before the internship starts. It must be issued in English and must not be older than 3 months at the time of the beginning of the erasmus stay.

Students should pay a complementary insurance ([check the price for each course](#)) at the time of registration, once the students arrive at the Faculty. The complementary insurance is a service offered by the University that consists of accident and civil responsibility insurance for university students resident in Spain.

The requirements for being evaluated are 100% compliance with the practice center's timetable (203 hours); and the fulfillment of at least 80% of attendance and active participation in the seminars, tutorials and the Workshop. Students are always supervised by a mentor who speaks English.

The course schedule is fixed during July and there is no possibility to change the semester of the courses. Furthermore, the exams are also established in January and June. In case you have to leave earlier, you can try to agree it with the professor, but it is only accepted under very exceptional situations.
