Access to the menció d'anglès (TEFL: Teaching English as a Foreign Language)

There are 2 ways to demonstrate that the candidate has a C1 level of English:

- Option 1: Officially documented accreditation (see webpage). These are submitted to gestió acadèmica. **CANDIDATES WITH OFFICIAL C1 CERTIFICATION HAVE PREFERENCE. ENTRY IS GUARANTEED UPON PRESENTATION OF CERTIFICATE.**
- Option 2: Onsite language assessment exam + an interview

- The Servei d'Idiomes of the UAB offers language exams that certify C1, in conjunction with Cambridge and L'associació espanyola de centres de llengües universitaris (ACLES). - **Important Information:** From May onwards, anyone sitting the exam at the Servei d'Idiomes or at an EOI, they can apply for Grants from the Generalitat. Information about option 2:

Potential candidates who are unable to certify a C1 level before June 20th, can sit an in-person exam, administered by teaching staff from the minor. The exam will have different components listening and reading comprehension and writing.

All candidates who sit the exam in phase 1 and demonstrate a C1 level in their results will be invited to an interview, also conducted by teaching staff members.

Important dates:

Exam: June 22nd. There will be 2 time slots (10 am- 1 pm; 3:30- 6:30 pm)

Candidates will be informed of the results by **June 26th.**

Interviews: June 29th. Exact times will be assigned to each individual.

This entry exam is **NOT** the equivalent of an official certificate. **No certificates will be issued upon completion of the exam.**

The application form will not accept responses following this deadline.

Once all applications have been received, the coordinator of the minor will confirm application receipts and slots for the language level exams. Information of the venue will be provided then.

Phase 1: Language exam (reading, writing, listening)

The date of the exam will be June 22nd. It will be administered in the morning and in the afternoon. Candidates should indicate their preference of time slot (morning or afternoon). Candidates should allocate at least 3 hours to complete the exam (although it may be shorter).

Results will be finalized by June 26th and candidates who have passed the exam will be invited to be interviewed.

Phase 2: Interviews

Interviews of candidates who have passed the first part of the exam will be held on **June 29th.**

Candidates will be informed **by email** of the exact time and place for their interview by **June 26th, 2026.**

NOTE: Candidates who do not sit the exam or do not take part in the interviews will not be admitted into the TEFL minor. No exceptions can be made.
